

#### **HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE**

## **Promoting Respectful and Inclusive Communication**

At Havant, we are committed to helping our students understand how the words we use can shape attitudes and beliefs — often without us even realising it. We're working to encourage language that is respectful, inclusive and supportive of everyone, regardless of gender.

As part of this important work, we'll be holding sessions with students to explore topics such as:

- How everyday language can reflect hidden (implicit) biases
- Recognising and avoiding sexist language
- How women are portrayed in the media

These discussions are part of a wider project focused on building a school culture where everyone feels heard, valued and respected.

#### We're also:

- Running workshops and campaigns to help students see how language influences how we treat each other
- · Encouraging open conversations with students, families and the wider community
- Challenging negative or harmful language in a constructive and supportive way

Our goal is to create an environment where girls feel safe, valued and confident to speak up and be themselves without fear of judgement and boys feel empowered to support each other in positive ways, speak out against harmful behaviour and embrace respectful, kind masculinity.

We look forward to working in partnership with you to support all our young people in growing into respectful, thoughtful and confident individuals.

### **Uniform adaptations - September 2025**

Every child should feel like they belong – especially at school. A school's uniform can bring the school community together and create a shared identity. From September 2025 we are going to adapt our current uniform to support our students and their families. The uniform will consist of:

- · Plain black skirt, just above knee
- Plain white polo shirt
- Havant Academy branded jumper
- Optional Havant Academy branded quarter zip fleece

Therefore, students may continue to attend school without a tie for the remainder of this academic year. We do not want families replacing the ties which they will not be required to wear in September.





#### **Year 7-9 Summer Assessments**

Students in Key Stage 3 will take the end of year assessments in the next few weeks. The majority of students will be assessed in:

- English
- Maths
- Science
- History
- Geography
- Spanish

## Your support








## Calling in Year 11 students:





The word mellifluous came from Latin roots: *mel* meaning honey and *fluere* meaning to flow. It literally means flowing like honey.









## **ENRICHMENT**

Auditions will take place on the following dates:






