Thank you to those of you that were able to attend the meeting with me on Wednesday evening. It is reassuring that our parents are keen to support the school on its improvement journey. For those of you unable to attend, I will send an overview of what I shared on Wednesday with you early next week. I am pleased to share that student behaviour has improved over the past 12 months; visitors to our school have spoken positively about the school's ethos and behaviour around the school. However, there is still a great deal to be done to ensure that all students are able to learn effectively in all areas of the school. Our immediate focus will be on eradicating low level disruption in lessons. The school can no longer tolerate students whose behaviour persistently interrupts the learning of others. We will continue to support those students who find accessing the learning difficult, but this will not be at the expense of the majority of students who attend every day ready and willing to learn. If the school is to move forward then we will need your support in this.

Following recent student feedback about queues at break and lunch times we have made some changes to the way students access food in the canteen. We have introduced a rota where each year group has a different day when they enter first. This has meant that the queues feel much calmer, students are served more quickly and are getting more break time. In addition, we are asking parents/carers to discuss and complete a Food Offer survey with your child/ren please. It is really important to have the student's views on school meals. Without their feedback and suggestions we cannot provide our external catering service with the information they require to ensure the best food offer and service. 








































RED HOUSE CHARITY DAY



In Outdoor Learning our students have been working together to develop skills in communication














NON-FICTION IN THE LIBRARY
